1. It helps, now and then, to step back and take the long view.

The Kingdom of God, of Truth and Love, Is *NOT* only beyond our efforts; it is beyond our vision.

We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work.

2. Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying

that the Kingdom always lies beyond us.

No speech says all that should be said.

No prayer fully expresses our faith.

No spiritual discipline brings perfection.

No care for another brings wholeness.

No program or project accomplishes our mission.

No set of goals and objectives includes everything.

ALL: THIS IS WHAT WE ARE ABOUT,

WE PLANT SEEDS THAT ONE DAY WILL GROW.

WE WATER SEEDS ALREADY PLANTED KNOWING THAT THEY HOLD FUTURE PROMISE.
